Love Larger Than Life: The Sahabah's Devotion to the Beloved Prophet

Has anyone in human history ever been loved as profoundly, as tenderly, and as enduringly as Muhammad ? For over fourteen centuries, his name has been whispered in adoration, his example emulated in devotion, and his remembrance woven into the very rhythm of life across continents and cultures. From the deserts of Arabia to the cities of the modern world, the Prophet remains the center of love unparalleled in human history.

On the Battlefield of Uhud

The Companions of the Prophet devotion was etched in blood.

- Abu Dujanah رضي الله عنه threw himself over the Prophet arrows piercing his back rather than striking the Messenger of Allah #
- Abu Talhah رضي الله عنه stood shielding him with his chest, saying: "O Messenger of Allah, do not raise your head! My neck is better than yours."
- Talhah ibn ʿUbaydillah رضي الله عنه carried the Prophet # while fending off attackers, moving him step by step to safety.
 - Nusaybah bint Kaʿb رضي الله عنها wielding her sword, fought men larger than herself and suffered a wound to her collarbone—an injury that would later lead to her martyrdom.

Even amid overwhelming loss, a woman who had lost her father, husband, brother, and son asked only: "But what of the Messenger of Allah?" Upon seeing him safe, she sighed: "Every calamity is bearable so long as you are well, O Messenger of Allah."

Love for the Prophet sonly deepened after his passing.

ʿAmr ibn al-ʿĀṣ رضي الله عنه confessed on his deathbed: "Had you asked me to describe him, I could not. For I could never feast my eyes upon him fully, out of awe and love for him."

the mu'adhin in whose voice had once soared with the Adhān, broke down in tears each time he tried to call it again. His heart could no longer bear it.

And ʿAbdullah ibn Zayd ibn ʿAbd Rabbih رضي الله عنه the Companion who had once seen the Prophet in a dream that brought the gift of the Adhān, prayed in anguish after the Prophet's death: "O Allah, take away my sight, for there is nothing left worth seeing after the Messenger of Allah. Let the last sight I behold in this world be his blessed face." Allah answered his prayer. He lost his vision, and his final memory of sight was of the Prophet

A Love That Never Ends

From scholars to saints, from leaders to ordinary believers, this love has endured through centuries. In the UK Muhammad was the most common baby name again. The UK Statistics Agency ONS, recorded that 4177 boys were named Muhammad in 2023.
